POLICY PREAMBLE

THIS POLICY DOES NOT OFFER ANY LIQUIDITY DURING THE FIRST FIVE YEARS OF THE CONTRACT. THE POLICYHOLDER WILL NOT BE ABLE TO SURRENDER OR WITHDRAW THE MONIES INVESTED IN LINKED INSURANCE PRODUCTS COMPLETELY OR PARTIALLY TILL THE END OF THE FIFTH YEAR.

This is a Unit Linked, Non-Participating, Individual, Savings Life Insurance Product. DEFINITIONS

Defined Term	Meaning
Age/ Age at entry:	means the age (last birthday) of the Policyholder / Life Insured in completed years as on Policy Commencement Date.
Annualised Premium:	means the premium amount payable in a year excluding taxes, rider premiums and underwriting extra premium on riders, if any.
Appointee:	means the person registered with us in the Nomination Schedule who is authorised to receive and hold in trust the benefits under this Policy on behalf of the Nominee/(s), if the Nominee/(s) is/are less than Age 18 on the date of payment.
Assignee:	means the person to whom the rights and benefits under this Policy are transferred by virtue of an assignment under section 38 of the Insurance Act, 1938 as amended from time to time.
Assignor:	means the person who transfers the rights of the life insurance Policy to the Assignee.
Charges:	means or refers to the charges listed in the Table of Charges under Section 2 of Part - E of this Policy Document.
Death Benefit:	means the Benefits which would be payable on death of the Life Insured and as specified in the Policy Contract.
Discontinuance:	means the state of a policy that could arise on account of surrender of the policy or non-payment of the premium due before the expiry of the Grace Period.
Discontinued Policy Fund:	means the segregated Fund of the Company constituted by the Fund Value, as applicable, of all the linked insurance policies discontinued during the Lock in Period.
Discontinuance Charge:	means the charge levied on the unit fund for individual unit linked insurance products where the policyholder opts for surrender or on discontinuance of the contract as stipulated under the Regulations.
Date of Discontinuance:	means the date on which the Company receives the intimation from you about Discontinuance of Policy or Surrender of Policy or on expiry of the Grace Period, whichever is earlier as specified in the provisions on Discontinuance of Premium Payment.
Fund/(s):	means the investment funds earmarked by the Company for unit linked business and available under this Policy and which are managed by us.
Fund Value / Unit Fund Value / Policy Fund Value:	means the summation of number of units in each segregated fund multiplied by the net asset value (NAV) for respective segregated fund under that policy.
Fully Paid-up:	means the state of the Policy when all Premiums payable for the entire Premium Paying Term have been paid in full.
Grace Period:	means a period of fifteen (15) days from the Premium Due Date specified in the Policy Schedule if the Premium is payable on a monthly basis and a period of thirty (30) days from the Premium Due Date specified in the Policy Schedule for all other frequencies, for the payment of premium, without any penalty/late fee, during which the Policy is considered to be In-Force with the risk cover without any interruptions, as per the terms and conditions of the Policy.
In-Force:	means the status of the policy during the Policy Term when all the due premiums have been paid or the policy is not in a state of discontinuance
IRDAI / Authority:	means Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India.
Insurance Act:	means The Insurance Act, 1938, as amended from time to time.

Investment Options:	means the options chosen by the Policyholder for investment of the Funds i.e. any one from the two Systematic Transfer Plans ('STP') or the Self-Managed Strategy.
Life Insured:	means the person named in the Policy Schedule on whose life the insurance cover has been accepted.
Little Champ Benefit:	means the additional death benefit option available to the Policyholder at inception of the Policy and as detailed under Section 1 (II) of Part - C.
Lock-in Period:	means the period of five consecutive complete years from the date of Commencement of the Policy, during which period the proceeds of the policies cannot be paid by the insurer to the policyholder or the insured, as the case may be, except in case of death or upon the happening of any other contingency covered under the policy.
Maturity Date:	means the date specified in the Policy Schedule on which this Policy matures and terminates.
Maturity Benefit:	means the benefit payable at the end of the Policy Term.
Modal Premium/ Premium/ premium:	means an amount stated in the Policy Schedule payable by you to us by the due dates, at the Premium Frequency, in the manner specified in the Policy Schedule, to secure the benefits under this Policy.
Net Asset Value:	means the price per Unit of the segregated Fund.
Nominee:	means the person/s named in the Policy Schedule who has/have been nominated by the Policyholder (who is also the Life Insured in the Policy) in accordance with Section 39 of the Insurance Act, 1938 as amended from time to time to receive benefits in respect of this Policy.
Partial Withdrawal:	means any amount withdrawn partially out of unit fund by the Policyholder during the term of the Policy.
Policy:	means the contract of insurance as evidenced by this Policy Document, the Proposal Form, the Policy Schedule and any other information/document/(s) attached or annexed including any endorsement attached to the Policy Document issued by us.
Policyholder / You / you / your:	means or refers to the Policyholder stated in the Policy Schedule.
Policy Option:	means one of the two Options as specified in the Policy Schedule (Option 1: is where Age at entry plus Policy Term is less than or equal to 99 years and Option 2: is where Age at entry plus Policy Term is 100 years)
Policy Term:	means the term of the Policy as specified in the Policy Schedule and is the time period between the Policy Commencement Date and the Maturity Date.
Policy Anniversary:	means the date in every year of the Policy Term corresponding with the Policy Commencement Date as specified in the Policy Schedule. If the said corresponding date is not available in the calendar year then the last day of that calendar month will be taken for this purpose.
Policy Month Anniversary:	means the date in every month of the Policy Term corresponding with the Policy Commencement Date as specified in the Policy Schedule. If the said corresponding date is not available in the calendar month then the last day of the calendar month will be taken for this purpose.
Policy Month:	means a period of one month starting from Policy Commencement Date as stated in the Policy Schedule and ending on the day immediately preceding the following Policy Month Anniversary date and each subsequent period of one month thereafter.
Policy Year:	means a period of twelve consecutive months starting from Policy Commencement Date as stated in the Policy Schedule and ending on the day immediately preceding the following Policy Anniversary date and each subsequent period of twelve consecutive months thereafter.

Policy Commencement Date:	means the date as shown in the Policy Schedule from which the Policy commences.
Policy Schedule:	means the Schedule and any endorsements attached to and forming part to this Policy and if any updated Schedule is issued, then the Schedule latest in time.
Premium Paying Term:	means the term in years as specified in the Policy Schedule during which the Premiums are payable by You to Us under this Policy.
Proposal Form:	means the signed and dated form and any accompanying declarations or statements submitted to Us by the Policyholder and/ or Life Insured as applicable for the purpose of obtaining insurance cover under this Policy.
Reduced Paid-up	means the state of the Policy in which the risk cover continues for a Paid-up Sum Assured. During the Reduced Paid-up state all applicable Charges would be deducted.
Regulations:	means the IRDAI (Insurance Products) Regulations 2024 and any other applicable laws issued and as may be amended from time to time.
Relevant Partial Withdrawals:	means Partial Withdrawals which will be adjusted from the Sum Assured while calculating the Death Benefit. It will be calculated as the sum of Partial Withdrawals made during the two-year period immediately preceding the date of death of the Life Insured. Partial Withdrawals made from the Top-up Fund shall not be deducted for this purpose.
Risk Commencement Date:	means the date as stated in the Policy Schedule on which your insurance coverage under this Policy commences.
Revival:	means restoration of the policy, which was discontinued due to the nonpayment of premium, by the insurer with all the benefits mentioned in the policy document, with or without rider benefits if any, upon the receipt of all the premiums due and other charges or late fee if any, during the revival period, as per the terms and conditions of the policy, upon being satisfied as to the continued insurability of the insured or policyholder on the basis of the information, documents and reports furnished by the policyholder, in accordance with Board approved underwriting policy.
Revival Period:	means the period of three consecutive complete years from the date of first unpaid premium.
Sum Assured	means the amount as specified in the Policy Schedule
Switch/(es):	means a facility allowing the policyholder to move from one segregated fund, either wholly or in part, to other segregated fund(s) amongst the segregated funds offered as per the terms and conditions of the policy.
Surrender:	means complete withdrawal or termination of the entire policy contract.
Surrender Value:	means an amount, if any, that becomes payable on surrender of a policy during its term, in accordance with the terms and conditions of the policy.
Systematic Withdrawal Plan ('SWP')	means the automated Partial Withdrawal facility as detailed in Section 2 b of Part D herein.
Top-up Premium:	means an amount that is paid voluntarily by the policyholder besides contractual premium and is treated as single premium for all purposes.
Top-up Sum Assured:	means the Sum Assured pertaining to Top-up Premium.
Total Premiums paid:	means the total of all the premiums received under the base product including top-ups premium paid, if any.
Unit:	means a specific portion or part of the underlying segregated linked fund which represents Policyholder's entitlement in such funds.

5. Top-up Premium

During the Policy Term[#], the Policyholder can pay additional premiums in a Policy Year, over and above the Policy Premium, subject to all due Premiums being paid in full at the time of making the Top-up Premium. [#]Top-up cannot be made in the five Policy Years prior to the Maturity Date of the Policy.

Top-up Premiums invested in the Policy will be managed in a separate Top-up account and would be locked-in for a period of five (5) years from the Premium Payment Date of the Top-up Premium.

The minimum amount for Top-up Premium is Rs.5,000/- and at any point of time during the Policy Term, the total Top-up Premiums paid shall not exceed the sum total of the Premiums paid to date, subject to our then underwriting guidelines.

Every Top-up premium payment will have a corresponding Top-up Sum Assured. The maximum Sum Assured on Top-up Premium shall be based on the Age at payment of Top-up Premium but not on the Age at entry of the Life Insured.

PART – D

Other Benefits

1. Surrender Benefit:

At any time during the Policy Term, the Policyholder can submit a written request to surrender the Policy.

If the request for Surrender is received before the completion of first 5 Policy Years:

The Fund Value net of Discontinuance Charge shall be credited to the Discontinued Policy Fund. Thereafter the treatment will be in accordance with the provisions as mentioned under 'Discontinuance of Premium' in Part C, section 4 c) and 'Policy Revival' in Part D, section 10.

If the request for Surrender is received after the completion of first 5 Policy Years:

The Policyholder shall be entitled to the Fund Value as on date of surrender and Policy will terminate.

2. Partial Withdrawal:

a.	The Policyholder is allowed to make a Partial Withdrawal from the Policy at any time after the completion of the fifth Policy Anniversary Year.
b.	<p>In case the Policyholder has opted for Systematic Withdrawal Plan ('SWP'), the Policyholder will receive the percentage of Fund Value (maximum can be 12% p.a. of Fund Value) on the payout frequency (yearly, half-yearly, quarterly or monthly) and from the Policy Year (not before 10th Policy Year) till the end of the Policy Term, all of which are as chosen by the Policyholder.</p> <p>SWP option can be chosen at the policy inception or anytime during the policy term. All such withdrawals under (a) and (b) above, will be first adjusted from the Top-up Fund Value[^], if available under the Policy at the time of Partial Withdrawal and then from the Policy Fund Value. There is a lock-in period of five years for each Top-Up Premium from the date of payment of that Top- Up Premium for the purpose of Partial Withdrawals.

[^] *Top-up Fund Value* shall exclude the Top-up Premium, which is locked in (for five years as per the Top-up provision in Section 5 of Part – C) as on the date of each request for Partial Withdrawal.

Both Systematic Withdrawal Plan and Partial Withdrawal can be availed simultaneously.

All such Partial Withdrawals under (a) and (b) above are subject to the following rules:

- Provided the Life Insured has attained an Age of 18 years.
- Minimum amount that can be withdrawn is Rs. 500 per withdrawal. If the withdrawn amount is less than Rs. 500 then such amount will not be paid.
- Maximum Partial Withdrawal: Fund value in excess of 105% of total premiums (including Top-Up Premium) paid till the time of withdrawal can be withdrawn. If the resultant Fund Value after payment of the Partial Withdrawal amount is less than 105% of total premiums paid (including Top-up premiums), then such benefit amount will not be paid.
- The Partial Withdrawals with respect to the Fund Value from the Premiums (excluding the Top-Up Premiums) will only be counted for the purpose of adjusting the Sum Assured to be payable on death as defined under Section 1 of Part C ('Relevant Partial Withdrawal'). Partial Withdrawals made from the Top-Up Premiums will not be deducted for this purpose.
- The Partial Withdrawals will not be allowed which would result in termination the Policy.
- All such Partial Withdrawals are not chargeable.

3. Settlement Options for Maturity Benefit

Instalments:

If you opt for the Settlement Option, you will receive a regular flow of Maturity amount, in instalments, for a payout period of 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5 years ('Settlement Term') and in a pre-determined frequency of payout ('yearly, half-yearly, quarterly or monthly instalments') as chosen by the Policyholder at least six months prior to the Maturity Date.

The amount paid to the Policyholder = the outstanding Fund Value as at the date of payout divided by the number of outstanding instalments.

Instalments payments will be made by redeeming the units from the Fund at the Unit Price applicable on the date of payment. The first instalment payment will be made on the Maturity Date of the Policy. Payment will be made through an ECS mode if the pre-determined frequency selected is half-yearly, quarterly or monthly.

No Guaranteed Addition, Loyalty Addition or Booster Addition will be available during the Settlement Term.

The risk cover shall be maintained at 105% of the total premiums paid. Accordingly, mortality Charges will be deducted.

The outstanding Fund Value will continue to remain invested in the existing Funds unless specifically switched by Policyholder. During the Settlement Term the investment risk in the investment portfolio will be borne by the Policyholder.

No charges except FMC, Switching Charges, if any, and Mortality Charges will be deducted during this period. The Policyholder will not be allowed to make Partial Withdrawal. Switches are allowed during this period.

Complete Withdrawal at any time during the Settlement Term:

The Policyholder can completely withdraw the outstanding Fund Value during the Settlement Term without any Charge. The outstanding Fund Value as on the date of complete withdrawal will be calculated as the total number of outstanding Units under the Fund multiplied by the NAV as on the date of the request for complete withdrawal.

In case of death of the Life Insured: The beneficiary of the Life Insured would receive higher of Balance Fund Value or 105% of the total premiums paid.

4. Switches

The Policyholder may make unlimited switches, without any Charge, at any time in a Policy Year, requesting the Company to switch a part or whole of the allocated Units from one investment Fund to another investment Fund as desired by the Policyholder. The minimum switch amount per switch must be Rs.5,000/-. In case your current Investment Option is any of the STPs, switching facility is not available.

5. Premium Redirection

The Policyholder may write to the Company, two weeks prior to the premium payment, requesting for a change in the premium allocation percentage of future premiums by using the premium re-direction facility. The change request shall then apply to all future Premiums including Top-up Premiums paid in the Policy after the change request being received and accepted by the Company. The Policyholder may use this facility for free, unlimited number of times in each Policy Year during the Policy Term other than the time when the Policy Fund is transferred to the Discontinued Policy Fund.

6. Policy Loan

There is no loan facility under this Policy

7. Change in Premium Paying Term

The Policyholder may request the Company for a change (increase or decrease) in the Premium Paying Term at any time while the Policy is In-Force but before the end of the existing Premium Paying Term subject to the requested Premium Paying Term being allowed under the Product and all other conditions in the Product being met and that all due Premiums till the date of such request have been paid in full. In case of decrease of premium paying term, the revised premium paying term shall not be less than 10 years. Hence, where existing premium paying term is 10 years or less, reduction of premium paying term is not allowed. Change in Premium Paying Term is not allowed if Little Champ Benefit is opted by you.

The above option shall be applicable such that illustrated Unit Fund value at maturity shall be at least 90% of total premium paid at 4% gross yield on the Unit Fund after allowing for all the deductions under the policy, including underwriting loadings, if any.

8. Termination of Policy

The Policy will terminate at the earliest of:

- i. The date of processing the Free Look cancellation request; or
- ii. The date of intimation about the death of the Life Insured; or
- iii. The Maturity Date; or
- iv. The date of Surrender of the Policy after the Lock in Period; or
- v. The date on which the Policy Forecloses; or
- vi. The date of receipt of your request to terminate the Settlement Option or on the expiry of the Settlement Term as chosen by you

9. Free Look Period:

You have a Free Look period of thirty (30) days beginning from the date of receipt of the Policy Document, whether received electronically or otherwise, to review the terms and conditions of this Policy. If you disagree with any of the terms or conditions, or otherwise, and you have not made any claims, you may return this Policy for cancellation to us by giving us written reasons for your objection within the said Free Look period.

We will refund the following amount to the Policyholder under the Free Look Period as follows:

Fund Value as on the date of cancellation of the Policy plus non-allocated premium, if any plus charges levied by cancellation of units minus (stamp duty charges + proportionate risk premium for the period of cover + expenses incurred by us on medical examination (if any) of Proposer/Life Insured).

To exercise the Free Look option, you would need to send the Policy Document along with a request letter to us at any of our branches or at our Corporate Office address. You are required to maintain the acknowledgement received from the Company as a proof of submission.

10. Policy Revival:

The Policyholder can revive the Policy within three years from the date of first unpaid premium

To exercise the Revival option, the Policyholder is required to provide the Company with a written application along with payment of all due and unpaid Premiums. The proof of continued insurability and medical examination, if required (medical examination cost to be borne by the Policyholder) and the results thereof would be reviewed by the Company as per the then Board approved underwriting norms.

Revival of policies on Discontinuance of Premiums (during the Lock in Period):

Where You revive the Policy, the Policy will be revived restoring the risk cover, along with the investments made in the segregated funds as chosen by You, out of the Discontinued Policy Fund, less the applicable charges as mentioned below in accordance to the terms and conditions of the Policy.

The Company at the time of revival:

- i. Shall collect all due and unpaid premiums will be collected without any interest or fee.
- ii. May levy Policy Administration Charge and Premium Allocation Charge as applicable during the Discontinuance period. Guarantee charges, if applicable during the discontinuance period, may be deducted provided the guarantee continues to be applicable. No other charges will be levied.
- iii. Shall add back to the Fund, the Discontinuance Charges deducted at the time of Discontinuance of the Policy.

Revival of a Discontinued Policy after the Lock-in Period:

Where You revive the Policy, the Policy shall be revived restoring the original risk cover in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Policy.

- a) The Company, at the time of Revival:
 - i) Shall collect all due and unpaid premiums under the Policy without charging any interest or fee. The rider, if any, may also be revived at the option of the Policyholder.
 - ii) May levy Premium Allocation Charge as applicable. The guarantee charges may be deducted, if guarantee continues to be applicable.
 - iii) No other charges shall be levied.

In case of revival of policies from discontinuance fund, no additions (Guaranteed Additions and Loyalty Additions) will be made in respect of past Policy Anniversaries.

Loyalty Additions are not added for reduced paid-up policy and for the Policies which are in the Revival Period. In case of revival of the Policy, no such Loyalty Additions will be made in respect of past Policy Anniversaries.

For investment of funds the policyholder can choose from any one of the two offered Systematic Transfer Plans ('STP') or can choose the Self-Managed Strategy wherein the policyholder can invest as per his/her choice of funds.

Switching and premium redirection is not allowed under the STP. However, the Policyholder may opt in or opt out of this option anytime during the Policy Term.

You understand and agree that the underlying assets relating to the Funds shall remain our absolute beneficial ownership.

b) Premium Allocation:

The Premium received, after deduction of the Premium Allocation Charges, will be allocated to the Funds in the Allocation Proportion as per the selected Risk Strategy.

c) What are Units:

Units are a proportionate part of the Fund which are created within the Fund and referenced to the underlying assets.

d) Determination of the Unit Price:

The Unit Price of each Fund shall be computed as set out below or by any other method as may be prescribed by the Regulator:

Systematic Transfer Plans (STP)

Life stage and duration based STP

This Systematic Transfer Plan is a function of attained age (Age at last birthday) of Life Insured and remaining Policy Term.

Under this STP, a proportion of the Fund Value will be allocated in Equity Large Cap Fund basis the below formula:

$$\text{Min}(100, \frac{(100 - \text{Attained Age}) * \text{Remaining Policy Term}}{10}) \%$$

In simple words, the allocation percentage in Equity Large Cap Fund will be equal to (100-attained age) multiplied by remaining Policy Term divided by 10. This allocation percentage cannot be more than 100%.

Balance Fund Value will be allocated in Bond Fund.

At start of every policy year the proportion will be determined basis the above formula and this fund proportion may undergo changes during the policy year due to differentiated fund growth. At any point of time, if the resolution does not meet your expectation or if you have not received any reply within a period of one month from the date of receipt of complaint by the Company, you may approach the Insurance Ombudsman for redressal as per Rule 13 and 14 of the Insurance Ombudsman Rules, 2017 ('Insurance Ombudsman Rules').

Powers of Insurance Ombudsman under Rule 13 of the Insurance Ombudsman Rules:

The Ombudsman shall receive and consider the following complaints or disputes relating to:

- a. delay in settlement of claims, beyond the time specified in the Regulations, framed under Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India Act, 1999;
- b. any partial or total repudiation of claims by the Company;
- c. disputes over Premium paid or payable in terms of insurance Policy;
- d. misrepresentation of Policy terms and conditions at any time in the Policy Document or Policy contract;
- e. legal construction of insurance policies in so far as the dispute relates to claim;
- f. policy servicing related grievances against the Company and their agents and intermediaries;
- g. issuance of life insurance Policy including health insurance policy which is not in conformity with the Proposal Form submitted by the Proposer;
- h. non-issuance of insurance Policy after receipt of Premium in life insurance including health insurance; and
- i. any other matter resulting from the violation of provisions of the Insurance Act, 1938 as amended from time to time or the Regulations, circulars, guidelines or instructions issued by the IRDAI from time to time or the terms and conditions of the Policy contract, in so far as they relate to issues mentioned at clauses (a) to (f) as mentioned above.

Manner in which complaint is to be made in accordance with Rule 14 of the Insurance Ombudsman Rules:

1. Any person who has a grievance against the Insurer/Company/Us, may himself or through his legal heirs make a complaint in writing to the Ombudsman within whose territorial jurisdiction the branch or office of the Company, complaint against or the residential address or place of residence of the complainant is located.
2. The complaint shall be in writing duly signed by the complainant or through his legal heirs, Nominee or Assignee and shall state clearly the name and address of the complainant, the name of the branch or office of the insurer against which the complaint is made, the fact giving rise to complaint, supported by documents, the nature and extent of the loss caused to the complainant and the relief sought from the Ombudsman.
3. No complaint to the Insurance Ombudsman shall lie unless:
 - (a) the complainant makes a written representation to the Company named in the complaint and—
 - i. either the Company had rejected the complaint; or
 - ii. the complainant had not received any reply within a period of one month after the Company received the complainant's representation; or
 - iii. the complainant is not satisfied with the reply given to him by the Company;
 - (b) The complaint is made within one year—
 - i. after the order of the Company rejecting the representation is received; or
 - ii. after receipt of decision of the Company which is not to the satisfaction of the complainant;
 - iii. after expiry of a period of one month from the date of sending the written representation to the Company if the Company named in the complaint fails to furnish reply to the complainant.
4. The Insurance Ombudsman shall be empowered to condone the delay in filing a complaint as mentioned above under (3) (b), as he may consider necessary, after calling for objections of the Company

against the proposed condonation and after recording reasons for condoning the delay and in case the delay is condoned, the date of condonation of delay shall be deemed to be the date of filing of the complaint, for further proceedings under the Insurance Ombudsman Rules.

5. No complaint before the Insurance Ombudsman shall be maintainable on the same subject matter on which proceedings are pending before or disposed of by any court or consumer forum or arbitrator.

Annexure - 1

Section 39 - Nomination by Policyholder

Nomination of a life insurance Policy is as below in accordance with Section 39 of the Insurance Act, 1938 as amended from time to time. The extant provisions in this regard are as follows:

01. The policyholder of a life insurance on his own life may nominate a person or persons to whom money secured by the policy shall be paid in the event of his death.

02. Where the nominee is a minor, the policyholder may appoint any person to receive the money secured by the policy in the event of policyholder's death during the minority of the nominee. The manner of appointment to be laid down by the insurer.

03. Nomination can be made at any time before the maturity of the policy.

04. Nomination may be incorporated in the text of the policy itself or may be endorsed on the policy communicated to the insurer and can be registered by the insurer in the records relating to the policy.

05. Nomination can be cancelled or changed at any time before policy matures, by an endorsement or a further endorsement or a will as the case may be.

06. A notice in writing of Change or Cancellation of nomination must be delivered to the insurer for the insurer to be liable to such nominee. Otherwise, insurer will not be liable if a bonafide payment is made to the person named in the text of the policy or in the registered records of the insurer.

07. Fee to be paid to the insurer for registering change or cancellation of a nomination can be specified by the Authority through Regulations.

08. On receipt of notice with fee, the insurer should grant a written acknowledgement to the policyholder of having registered a nomination or cancellation or change thereof.

09. A transfer or assignment made in accordance with Section 38 shall automatically cancel the nomination except in case of assignment to the insurer or other transferee or assignee for purpose of loan or against security or its reassignment after repayment. In such case, the nomination will not get cancelled to the extent of insurer's or transferee's or assignee's interest in the policy. The nomination will get revived on repayment of the loan.

10. The right of any creditor to be paid out of the proceeds of any policy of life insurance shall not be affected by the nomination.

11. In case of nomination by policyholder whose life is insured, if the nominees die before the policyholder, the proceeds are payable to policyholder or his heirs or legal representatives or holder of succession certificate.

12. In case nominee(s) survive the person whose life is insured, the amount secured by the policy shall be paid to such survivor(s).

13. Where the policyholder whose life is insured nominates his:

- a. parents or
- b. spouse or
- c. children or
- d. spouse and children
- e. or any of them

- the nominees are beneficially entitled to the amount payable by the insurer to the policyholder unless it is proved that policyholder could not have conferred such beneficial title on the nominee having regard to the nature of his title.

14. If nominee(s) die after the policyholder but before his share of the amount secured under the policy is paid, the share of the expired nominee(s) shall be payable to the heirs or legal representative of the nominee or holder of succession certificate of such nominee(s).

15. The provisions of sub-section 7 and 8 (13 and 14 above) shall apply to all policies maturing for payment on the commencement of The Insurance Act, 1938.

16. If policyholder dies after maturity but the proceeds and benefit of the policy has not been paid to him because of his death, his nominee(s) shall be entitled to the proceeds and benefit of the policy.

17. The provisions of this Section 39 are not applicable to any life insurance policy to which Section 6 of Married Women's Property Act, 1874 ('MWP Act') applies or has at any time applied except where, a nomination is made in favour of spouse or children or spouse and children whether or not on the face of the policy it is mentioned that it is made under Section 39. Where nomination is intended to be made to spouse or children or spouse and children under Section 6 of MWP Act, it should be specifically mentioned on the policy. In such a case only, the provisions of Section 39 will not apply.

Annexure - 2

Section 38 - Assignment and Transfer of Insurance Policies

Assignment or Transfer of a Policy should be in accordance with Section 38 of the Insurance Act, 1938 as amended from time to time. The extant provisions in this regard are as follows:

01. This policy may be transferred/assigned, wholly or in part, with or without consideration.
02. An Assignment may be effected in a policy by an endorsement upon the policy itself or by a separate instrument under notice to the Insurer.
03. The instrument of assignment should indicate the fact of transfer or assignment and the reasons for the assignment or transfer, antecedents of the assignee and terms on which assignment is made.
04. The assignment must be signed by the transferor or assignor or duly authorized agent and attested by at least one witness.
05. The transfer of assignment shall not be operative as against an insurer until a notice in writing of the transfer or assignment and either the said endorsement or instrument itself or copy there of certified to be correct by both transferor and transferee or their duly authorised agents have been delivered to the insurer.
06. Fee to be paid for assignment or transfer can be specified by the Authority through Regulations.
07. On receipt of notice with fee, the insurer should Grant a written acknowledgement of receipt of notice. Such notice shall be conclusive evidence against the insurer of duly receiving the notice.
08. If the insurer maintains one or more places of business, such notices shall be delivered only at the place where the policy is being serviced.
09. The insurer may accept or decline to act upon any transfer or assignment or endorsement, if it has sufficient reasons to believe that it is
 - a. not bonafide or
 - b. not in the interest of the policyholder or
 - c. not in public interest or
 - d. is for the purpose of trading of the insurance policy.
10. Before refusing to act upon endorsement, the Insurer should record the reasons in writing and communicate the same in writing to Policyholder within 30 days from the date of policyholder giving a notice of transfer or assignment.
11. In case of refusal to act upon the endorsement by the Insurer, any person aggrieved by the refusal may prefer a claim to IRDAI within 30 days of receipt of the refusal letter from the Insurer.
12. The priority of claims of persons interested in an insurance policy would depend on the date on which the notices of assignment or transfer is delivered to the insurer; where there are more than one instruments of transfer or assignment, the priority will depend on dates of delivery of such notices. Any dispute in this regard as to priority should be referred to Authority.
13. Every assignment or transfer shall be deemed to be absolute assignment or transfer and the assignee or transferee shall be deemed to be absolute assignee or transferee, except
 - a. where assignment or transfer is subject to terms and conditions of transfer or assignment; OR
 - b. where the transfer or assignment is made upon condition that
 - i. the proceeds under the policy shall become payable to policyholder or nominee(s) in the event of assignee or transferee dying before the insured OR
 - ii. the insured surviving the term of the policySuch conditional assignee will not be entitled to obtain a loan on policy or surrender the policy. This provision will prevail notwithstanding any law or custom having force of law which is contrary to the above position.
14. In other cases, the insurer shall, subject to terms and conditions of assignment, recognize the transferee or assignee named in the notice as the absolute transferee or assignee and such person
 - a. shall be subject to all liabilities and equities to which the transferor or assignor was subject to at the date of transfer or assignment and

- b. may institute any proceedings in relation to the policy
- c. obtain loan under the policy or surrender the policy without obtaining the consent of the transferor or assignor or making him a party to the proceedings

15. Any rights and remedies of an assignee or transferee of a life insurance policy under an assignment or transfer effected before commencement of the Insurance Laws (Amendment) Ordinance, 2014 shall not be affected by this section.

Annexure - 3

Section 45 – Policy shall not be called in question on the ground of mis-statement after three years

Provisions regarding policy not being called into question in terms of Section 45 of the Insurance Act, 1938 as amended from time to time are as follows:

01. No Policy of Life Insurance shall be called in question **on any ground whatsoever** after expiry of 3 years from

- a. the date of issuance of policy; or
- b. the date of commencement of risk; or
- c. the date of revival of policy; or
- d. the date of rider to the policy

- whichever is later.

02. On the ground of fraud, a policy of Life Insurance may be called in question within 3 years from

- a. the date of issuance of policy or
- b. the date of commencement of risk or
- c. the date of revival of policy or
- d. the date of rider to the policy

- whichever is later.

For this, the insurer should communicate in writing to the insured or legal representative or nominee or assignees of insured, as applicable, mentioning the ground and materials on which such decision is based.

03. Fraud means any of the following acts committed by insured or by his agent, with the intent to deceive the insurer or to induce the insurer to issue a life insurance policy:

- a. The suggestion, as a fact of that which is not true and which the insured does not believe to be true;
- b. The active concealment of a fact by the insured having knowledge or belief of the fact;
- c. Any other act fitted to deceive; and
- d. Any such act or omission as the law specifically declares to be fraudulent.

04. Mere silence is not fraud unless, depending on circumstances of the case, it is the duty of the insured or his agent keeping silence to speak or silence is in itself equivalent to speak.

05. No Insurer shall repudiate a life insurance Policy on the ground of Fraud, if the Insured / beneficiary can prove that the misstatement was true to the best of his knowledge and there was no deliberate intention to suppress the fact or that such mis-statement of or suppression of material fact are within the knowledge of the insurer. Onus of disproving is upon the policyholder, if alive, or beneficiaries.

06. Life insurance Policy can be called in question within 3 years on the ground that any statement of or suppression of a fact material to expectancy of life of the insured was incorrectly made in the proposal or other document basis which policy was issued or revived or rider issued. For this, the insurer should communicate in writing to the insured or legal representative or nominee or

assignees of insured, as applicable, mentioning the ground and materials on which decision to repudiate the policy of life insurance is based.

07. In case repudiation is on ground of mis-statement and not on fraud, the premium collected on policy till the date of repudiation shall be paid to the insured or legal representative or nominee or assignees of insured, within a period of 90 days from the date of repudiation.

08. Fact shall not be considered material unless it has a direct bearing on the risk undertaken by the insurer. The onus is on insurer to show that if the insurer had been aware of the said fact, no life insurance policy would have been issued to the insured.

09. The insurer can call for proof of age at any time if he is entitled to do so and no policy shall be deemed to be called in question merely because the terms of the policy are adjusted on subsequent proof of age of life insured. So, this Section will not be applicable for questioning age or adjustment based on proof of age submitted subsequently.
